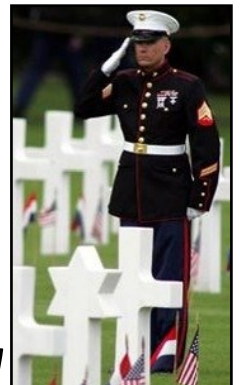

This year's meeting falls after our November General Election which gives us a chance to toast our President for the many good things he's already accomplished that the mainstream media will never report or acknowledge!

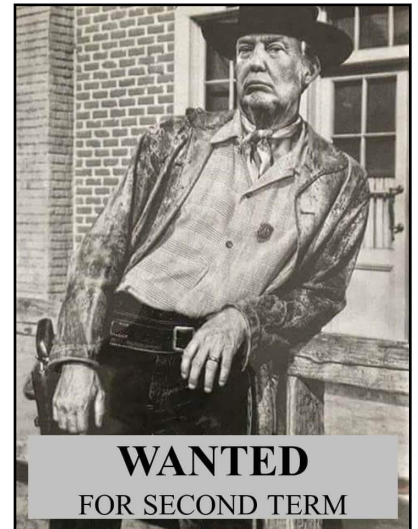

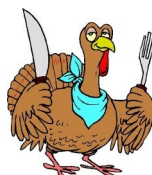

About our Speaker Lieutenant Colonel Warren C. Cook Jr.

Lieutenant Colonel Warren C. Cook Jr. serves as the Commanding Officer for Second Battalion, Fourth Marines, 5th Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division.

Lieutenant Colonel Cook was born in Boston, Massachusetts in 1975 and commissioned in May 1998 after graduation from Williams College. From 1999-2001 he served in the 1st Marine Division as a Platoon and Company Commander in the 2d Battalion, 4th Marines, deploying with the 31st Marine Expeditionary Unit.

In 2001, he reported to the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade, where he served as Aide to the Commanding General and Commander Task Force 58 during operations in southern Afghanistan. In 2002, he was transferred to 1st Marine Division, where he served as Aide to the Commanding General during Operation Iraqi Freedom. From 2004-2006, he was assigned to the School of Infantry at Camp Pendleton and served as a Company Commander and the Instructor Group Officer-in-Charge.

From 2006-2008, Lieutenant Colonel Cook returned to the 1st Marine Division and served as a Company Commander with 3d Battalion, 1st Marines during Operation Iraqi Freedom. In 2008, he reported to 2d Battalion, 1st Marines, and deployed to Iraq as a Military Transition Team Leader, advising Iraqi Security Forces in the Al Anbar Province.

From 2009-2012 he commanded Recruiting Station Los Angeles. From 2013-2014 Lieutenant Colonel Cook served as the Junior Aide de Camp to the Commandant. Most recently, he was assigned to United States Pacific Command's Strategy and Policy Directorate.

Lieutenant Colonel Cook is a graduate of the U.S. Army Infantry Captain Career Course, the Weapons Tactics Instructor Course, and the U.S. Naval Command and Staff College. He and his wife Eliza, have three daughters: Piper, Whitney, and Chloe.

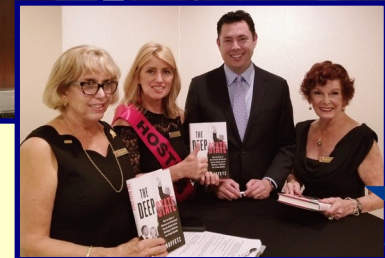

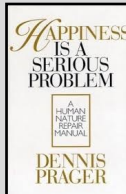

BOOK REPORT

Dennis Praeger's HAPPINESS IS A SERIOUS PROBLEM, received the highest rating of 5 from all Book Club members attending the October 17 meeting. Praeger identifies the desire for happiness as one of the nearly universal and distinguishing features of human beings. From a request to deliver a "not so serious" talk, to more than 20 years of publishing, this book has been a best seller around the globe that has enlightened its readers about the obstacles to happiness and the attitudes and behaviors that are essential to attaining it. Praeger describes our human nature as insatiable, and that in order for us to be happy, we first have to battle ourselves. He postulates that to be happy requires three things: knowledge, or wisdom in how to achieve it, hard work, and self discipline. Agreeing with his secondary title, this book is a HUMAN NATURE REPAIR MANUAL. It contains so much to be learned, that it surely can accompany a reader through years of reflection and positive self action.

TRUMP'S SPEECH AT THE UN RESTORED GLOBAL LEADERSHIP

In the tumult of the circus surrounding Judge Brett Kavanaugh's Supreme Court nomination, little attention was paid to President Donald Trump's speech last week before the United Nations.

This is a shame, because his address last week was arguably the most significant foreign policy address any U.S. president has delivered since the end of the Cold War.

Many of Trump's critics insist his view of the world rejects the liberal world order America has led and defended since the end of World War II. But that assessment misconstrues Trump's world view. Indeed, that ignores it.

Trump's critics cannot see his world view because they are convinced the universe of foreign policy is but a narrow linear spectrum that veers between isolationism and globalism.

Trump, who has been a peripatetic foreign policy practitioner since his early days in office, is manifestly not an isolationist. He does not believe the U.S. can walk away from the world. He is deeply engaged with the world.

His argument with the globalists is not about whether the U.S. should be engaged with the world. His dispute with globalists and globalism revolves around the form U.S. involvement should take and what the proper goal of that involvement should be.

The four post-Cold War presidents who preceded him in office — George H.W. Bush, Bill Clinton, George W. Bush and Barack Obama — differed on many things. But they shared the basic globalist view that U.S. foreign policy should be undertaken to advance ideological goals not directly related to U.S. national interests. They all agreed with the basic proposition that the U.S. should carry out its foreign policy under the aegis of international or transnational governing structures, which they perceived as somehow more credible than unilateral action or action undertaken in informal cooperation with likeminded governments.

In his address at the UN, Trump rejected that general disposition. Trump explained that the purpose of U.S. foreign policy is not to advance hypothetical universal values. It is to promote real American interests.

He declared forthrightly, "We reject the ideology of globalism, and we embrace the doctrine of patriotism."

Trump's opponents insist that his nationalist worldview is antithetical to American values and traditions. But this is wrong. At the UN, Trump rightly rooted his nationalist foreign policy in the Monroe Doctrine, named for America's fifth president James Monroe, who announced in 1823 that while the U.S. would not interfere with existing European colonies in the Western Hemisphere, or in the internal affairs of European powers, it would view any future effort by European powers to colonize independent states in the Western Hemisphere as "the manifestation of an unfriendly disposition toward the United States."

The Monroe Doctrine guided U.S. foreign policy for a century. It protected both the United States and the independence of the nations of Latin America.

In the aftermath of World War I, then-President Woodrow Wilson, arguably the first globalist president, sought to tether the U.S. to the League of Nations, a global government created in the 1919 Treaty of Versailles. The League of Nations was supposed to prevent war through global consensus.

Opposition to the treaty in the Senate was led by then-Senate Majority Leader Henry Cabot Lodge (R-MA). Lodge's 1919 speech explaining why the U.S. must never accept any form of global governing authority that would diminish its sovereignty and independence blocked ratification of the treaty. In his speech, Lodge spelled out a nationalist vision for U.S. foreign policy that Trump now continues.

Lodge said, "National I must remain, and in that way, I like all other Americans can render the amplest service to the world. The United States is the world's best hope, but if you fetter her in the interests and quarrels of other nations...you will destroy her power for good and endanger her very existence. Leave her to march freely through the centuries to come as in the years that have gone. Strong, generous and confident, she has nobly served mankind."

At the UN, Trump echoed Lodge's words from 99 years ago.

"We are standing up for America and for the American people. And we are also standing

up for the world," he explained.

Throughout his speech, Trump embraced America's leadership role in the world, but made clear that the purpose of U.S. leadership is first and foremost to secure American interests.

For instance, while he praised North Korean dictator Kim Jong-un's "courage" for freeing American hostages, suspending nuclear and ballistic missile testing, and returning the remains of U.S. servicemen killed in the Korean War, Trump also said, without apology, that U.S. nuclear sanctions against North Korea "will stay in place until denuclearization occurs."

Trump was even more forthright in his defense of his trade policies. After explaining how the trading policies and agreements he inherited have harmed the U.S. and benefited rule breakers, Trump turned directly to the greatest rule breaker: China.

"I have great respect and affection for my friend, President Xi," he said, "but I have made clear our trade imbalance is just not acceptable. China's market distortions and the way they deal cannot be tolerated."

He gave much the same message to OPEC countries and to nations that receive U.S. financial and military assistance.

Regarding financial aid, Trump announced, "We are only going to give foreign aid to those who respect us and, frankly, are our friends. And we expect other countries to pay their fair share for the cost of their defense."

The globalists argue that these sorts of statements harm America's standing in the world by placing America's allies and adversaries on the same moral plane. But they never explain how a nation like Germany, which has been outspoken in its efforts to undermine U.S. sanctions against Iran, and has accepted total energy dependence on Russia is in fact, a U.S. ally. They do not explain why it is more important for the U.S. to stand for populist forces like Egypt's Muslim Brotherhood in pursuit of chimerical "democracy" than for it to stand with a friendly yet authoritarian regime like that of Egyptian President Abdel Fatah a-Sisi, which shares the U.S.'s profound interest in defeating jihadists.

Trump's essential message is that the foundation of nationalist foreign policy is reality rather than ideology.

"America's policy of principled realism," he explained, "means we will not be held hostage to old dogmas, discredited ideologies, and so-called experts who have been proven wrong over the years, time and time again."

In accepting the world as it is, his foreign policy doctrine is far friendlier to the nations of the world than the neo-imperialist policies of the globalists. The globalist aspiration to world government ignores differences in cultures and traditions in an effort to push everyone into an amorphous, homogeneous body of "internationalists" under governing structures that reflect the globalist aspiration and faith in nonexistent universal political traditions.

Trump waxed poetic about the rich diversity of the world community of distinct and proud nations.

"Each of us here today is the emissary of a distinct culture, a rich history, and a people bound together by ties of memory, tradition, and the values that make our homelands like nowhere else on Earth," he said.

"I honor the right of every nation in this room to pursue its own customs, beliefs, and traditions. The United States will not tell you how to live or work or worship.

"We only ask that you honor our sovereignty in return."

At the conclusion of his speech, he explained how "the doctrine of patriotism" can bring nations together to achieve common goals.

As always, he began his explanation by describing America first.

"In America, we believe in the majesty of freedom and the dignity of the individual. We believe in self-government and the rule of law. And we prize the culture that sustains our liberty — a culture built on strong families, deep faith, and fierce independence. We celebrate our heroes, we treasure our traditions, and above all, we love our country."

He then turned to his audience, the nations of the world.

"Inside everyone in this great chamber today, and everyone listening all around the globe, there is the heart of a patriot that feels the same powerful love for your nation, the same intense loyalty to your homeland....

"Our task is not to erase it, but to embrace it....

Trump's doctrine of patriotism, maligned as somehow un-American by his critics, is the most American of doctrines. His speech was a seminal event in U.S. foreign policy because it restored a long tradition of American foreign policy.

No longer will it be possible to pretend away a long tradition of America-centered U.S. foreign policy. No longer will it be possible to pretend that the U.S. has but two choices: to isolate itself and abdicate world leadership or to embrace various institutions of global governance that limit U.S. sovereignty.

As Lodge put it in 1919, "Our idea is to make [America] ever stronger and better and finer, because in that way alone, as we believe, can she be of the greatest service to the world's peace and to the welfare of mankind."

Trump has not relinquished American global leadership. He has restored it.



Trump Alerts the Military to Ready Deployment to Southern Border

Upwards of 10,000 Central American immigrants are planning to overwhelm U.S. Border Patrol agents and the clock is ticking down on whether or not President Donald Trump will deploy the military to stop the illegal incursion.



The mostly Honduran members of the caravan have garnered international attention by claiming they only seek safe refuge from the upheaval in their home country. But that claim is obviously false as they are determined to cross through Guatemala, El Salvador, and Mexico without applying for asylum.

The goal is to make it to the U.S. border and force Immigration and Customs Enforcement to catch and release them into the country. Once on American soil, they can disappear into the population and siphon off taxpayer-funded welfare benefits. The president has already warned that this massive caravan is rife with criminals escaping potential incarceration in Honduras and many fear ISIS operatives have embedded themselves into the group.

"Sadly, it looks like Mexico's Police and Military are unable to stop the caravan heading to the southern border of the United States," the president tweeted. "Criminals and unknown Middle Easterners are mixed in. I have alerted Border Patrol and Military that this is a National Emergency."

The crisis represents a worst case scenario example of the failed Democrat-enacted laws and liberal judges that have broken the country's ability to maintain its border integrity. Members of the violent street gang known as MS-13 have reportedly hidden in the caravan as a means to penetrate the U.S. border. MS-13 and other Central American gangs have been steadily migrating into the United States and have been convicted of selling drugs, murdering and raping American citizens—children included.

"I would call in the military and I would seal off the border. I would close up the border. If that happens, and if that continues to move forward, the caravan we're talking about," Trump said. "I think some bad people started that caravan. You have some very, very bad people in the caravan. But I will seal off the border before they come into this country."

Congressional leaders Nancy Pelosi and Chuck Schumer have urged fellow Democrats to remain silent about the Southern border crisis as the election nears.

"The president is desperate to change the subject from health care to immigration because he knows that health care is the #1 issue Americans care about," Pelosi and Schumer stated in a joint press release. If anyone didn't believe the Democrats' goal was to erase the country's borders, the imminent dangers moving across Mexico right now should remove any doubt.

The president has already taken a tough stance with the governments who facilitate the thousands-strong caravan of illegals and criminals. The United States generously provides hundreds of millions in aid to Guatemala, El Salvador, and Honduras. Like other nations that act against American interests, the president will end tax-payer funded support as a first measure.

"Guatemala, Honduras, and El Salvador were not able to do the job of stopping people from leaving their country and coming illegally to the U.S.," President Trump tweeted. "We will now begin cutting off, or substantially reducing, the massive foreign aid routinely given to them."

The next step will certainly be to deploy the U.S. military and completely shutting down the southern border. Although the caravan has only recently crossed into southern Mexico, the timeline for their assault on America's border could be a week or only a matter of just days away.

The Center for Immigration Studies policy director Jessica Vaughn points out that mass groups in the past have jumped on train rail cars to speed their way to the U.S. Although the practice of boarding trains in this fashion is widely considered illegal, Mexican police appear to not have the resources to handle them.

Federal authorities at the Guatemala-Mexico border already conceded their authority by allowing the caravan to cross undocumented and that has emboldened the illegal immigrants, gang members, and other criminals. With the White House closely monitoring the caravan's progress, the military could be called to shut down the border within days.

The world is closely monitoring the caravan crisis. If the U.S. demonstrates it cannot maintain the integrity of its own borders, America's ability to lead on the global stage will be greatly diminished.

TALKING POINTS

- President Trump has appointed women to six Cabinet-level positions (**Elaine Chao**, Secretary of Transportation; **Betsy DeVos**, Secretary of Education; **Kirstjen Nielsen**, Secretary of Homeland Security; **Linda McMahon**, Administrator of the Small Business Administration; **Gina Haspel**, Director of Central Intelligence; and **Nikki Haley**, Ambassador to the United Nations).
- The lead spokespersons for the White House, the Pentagon, the State Department, and the Justice Department are women.
 - **Sarah Huckabee Sanders** is the first mother - and only the third woman - to hold the position of White House Press Secretary

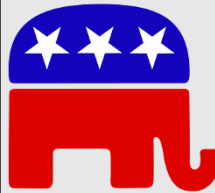

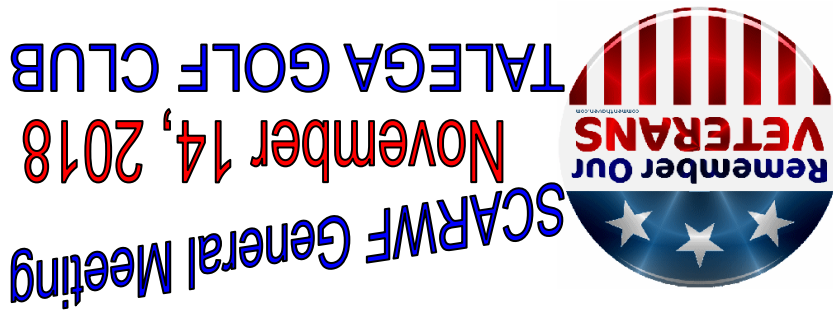
